Introduction

Oxford Capital Management Inc ("Adviser") is registered with the US Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") as an investment adviser. Brokerage and investment advisory services and fees differ and it is important for you to understand these differences. What types of investment services and advice can you provide me?

We offer investment advisory services to retail investors for an ongoing asset-based fee calculated on the aggregate market value of all assets under management, including allocations of cash. If you open and account with us, we will meet with you to understand your current financial situation, goals, and risk tolerance. Based on what we learn, we will recommend a portfolio of investments that is monitored on a continuous basis. We will conduct an internal review of you account on at least a quarterly basis and, if necessary, rebalance to meet changing needs.

Most of our client accounts are managed on a discretionary basis, which means we don't need to call you when buying or selling in your account. Accounts managed on a non-discretionary basis means that you make the ultimate decision regarding purchases or sale of investments. What fees and costs will I pay?

Fees and costs affect the value of your account over time. We generally a negotiable asset-based fee ranging from 0.4% and 0.8% annually based on the value of assets in your account on a quarterly basis. Our incentive is to increase the value of your account over time, which will increase our fees over time. Your fees can be pulled from your account or paid separately.

The custodian or broker-dealer that holds your assets can also charge you account fees as well as transaction fees when we buy or sell investments for you. The fees are in addition to our advisory fee. We do not receive nor share in any portion of those custodial or transaction fees. Some investments, such as mutual funds, exchange traded funds, and private funds charge additional fees that will reduce the value of your investments over time.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying. Additional information about our fees is location in Item 5 of our Firm Brochure. What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have fiduciary duty to place the interest of our clients ahead of our own and the firm. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. The firm's revenue is from advisory fees we collect from your accounts quarterly. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you. For example, employees are permitted to trade alongside client accounts as long as they receive the average price that is applicable to the clients and pay their share of the transaction costs; otherwise, all client orders go ahead of employees.

• How might your conflicts of interest affect me, and how will you address them?

How do your financial professionals make money?

Our financial professionals are paid fixed monthly. As employees and owners, the financial professionals may receive compensation based on the overall revenues of the firm.

Do you or your financial professionals have legal or disciplinary history?
