

Form ADV Part 3 - Client Relationship Summary

Armbruster Capital Management, Inc. is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission as an investment advisor. Investment advisors and brokers provide different services and fee schedules, and it is important for investors to understand the differences. Free and simple tools are available to research firms and financial professionals at https://www.investor.gov/CRS, which also provides educational materials about broker-dealers and investment advisors, as well as general information on investing.

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

ACM offers investment advisory services for individual, corporate, and institutional investors. Our core business is the discretionary management of investment portfolios. However, when discussing appropriate investment solutions with clients, financial planning issues often arise. ACM does not provide comprehensive financial planning advice but will offer guidance on such issues as part of its wealth management offering.

ACM works with clients to set up investment solutions and provide on-going portfolio management services. We start by meeting to discuss our philosophy and to gather information about each client's personal and financial circumstances. Later, we propose what we believe will be an appropriate investment plan, based upon the client's unique risk tolerance and return objectives. This plan lays out our recommended asset mix among stocks, bonds, cash, and alternative investments. We try to maintain this asset mix through time, rebalancing to meet asset allocation targets as taxes and other constraints allow.

Each portfolio is customized to each individual client's goals and needs. Clients' tax circumstances and other personal preferences are factored into how a portfolio is constructed.

- *Monitoring*: Accounts are monitored on an ongoing basis as part of our standard services.
- *Investment Authority*: ACM generally has investment discretion on client accounts, except for some 401(k) plans. Clients sign an investment management agreement at the inception of our relationship that gives us the ability to trade their accounts. This document also specifies a target asset allocation and notes any limitations on our authority to manage the portfolio.
- Limited Investment Offerings: ACM offers advice on all types of investment offerings.
- Account Minimums: ACM typically requires a minimum of \$1 million of assets under management to establish a new relationship with a client. This will be reviewed on an individual basis and family relationships are taken into account.

What fees will I pay?

Principal Fees and Costs: ACM is compensated solely based on fees for its services. Our regular fee schedule is:

- Assets under management ≤ \$1 million are billed 0.60% annually.
- Assets under management >\$1 million are billed 0.40% annually.

All accounts within a single immediate family relationship are grouped when calculating fees. Fixed fees may be used depending on individual circumstances. Fees may be negotiable in some cases.

Fees are generally deducted directly from client accounts. Accounts are generally billed monthly in arrears.

Other Fees and Costs: In addition to our fees, there are other costs implicit in the investment process. These include mutual fund expense ratios, alternative investment purchasing and custody fees, and trading commissions paid to the custodial firm. These fees do not accrue to ACM, but compensate the custodial firm and mutual funds for their services.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

Help me understand how these fees and costs might affect my investments. If I give you \$10,000 to invest, how much will go to fees and costs, and how much will be invested for me?

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means.

Examples of ways we make money and conflicts of interest:

- The more assets there are in your advisory account, the more you will pay in fees, and thus there is an incentive to encourage you to increase the assets in your account.
- Because stocks grow faster than bonds on average over time, we may be incentivized to encourage you to put more money into stocks.
