# Item 1 – Introduction: Is an investment advisory account right for you?

Wealth Solutions USA, LLC is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission as an investment adviser. Please be aware that brokerage and investment advisory services and fees differ and it is important for you to understand the differences. Free and simple tools are available to research firms and financial professionals at <a href="Investor.gov/CRS">Investor.gov/CRS</a>, which also provides educational materials about broker-dealers, investment advisers, and investing.

# Item 2 – What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We offer investment advisory services to retail investors. Our principal service is a family office service which includes various aspects of financial planning, portfolio monitoring and the selection of other advisers. We provide our services on a discretionary or non-discretionary basis. Discretionary arrangements allow us to determine the specific securities, and the amount of securities, to be purchased or sold from your account without your approval prior to each transaction. Non-discretionary arrangements require us to obtain your approval prior to making any changes to your portfolio. We do not limit our advice to proprietary products (we don't have proprietary products), or a limited menu of products or types of investments. In general, we require a minimum of \$10,000,000 to establish a relationship with us. At our discretion, we reserve the right to waive this minimum.

## Item 3 – What fees will I pay?

We are primarily compensated by a percentage of assets under our advisement, hourly and fixed fees. Our fees vary depending on the services you receive. Fees are based upon a percentage of your assets under our advisement and are payable monthly or quarterly basis depending on the terms of the agreement. We may also negotiate hourly or fixed fee arrangements. When the fee is based on a percentage of assets under our advisement, the more assets there are in your advisory account, the more you will pay in fees. Therefore, we have an incentive to encourage you to increase the assets in your account. Fees are negotiated with you on a case-by-case basis and vary based on the complexity of your financial profile, unique investment needs and goals.

Description of Other Fees and Costs: The fees that you pay to our firm for investment advisory services are separate and distinct from the fees and expenses charged by third party advisers, including the advisers that we have chosen to manage your account(s). Additionally, our fee does not include fees charged by investment companies like mutual funds, exchange traded funds, unit investment trusts and variable annuities. These fees are described in each fund's prospectus. These fees will generally include a management fee and other fund expenses. You will also incur transaction charges and/or brokerage fees when purchasing or selling securities. These charges and fees are typically imposed by the broker-dealer or custodian that executes the trade. The broker-dealer or custodian may also charge your account for custodial fees, retirement account fees, trust fees, exchange fees, redemption fees that may be assessed on investment company shares, transfer fees, account termination fees or other special service fees and charges. We do not share in any portion of these fees imposed by the broker-dealer or custodian. To fully understand the total cost you will incur, you should review all the fees charged by third party advisers, investment companies, broker-dealers, our firm, and others.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any

amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you. Here is an example to help you understand what this means:

All investment advisers face conflicts of interest which are inherent in the business. Our primary source of
compensation is through asset based fees. Therefore, we are incentivized to acquire new clients and to increase
assets under management. Other conflicts of interest result from other business activities we engage in and
relationships we have with business partners and third parties, or affiliations we have established with other
financial institutions.

Conversation Starter. Ask your financial professional—

How might your conflicts of interest affect me, and how will you address them?

# How do your financial professionals make money?

Our financial professionals either receive salary based compensation or a percentage of advisory billings. Additionally, financial advisors who are part owners of our firm receive a percentage of profits generated by our firm. Therefore, our financial professionals have an incentive to encourage you to increase the assets in your account and to increase our firm's profits.
