

Introduction

Our firm, Skylar Wealth Management LLC, is an investment adviser registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. We feel that it is important for you to understand how advisory and brokerage services and fees differ in order to determine which type of account is right for you. There are free and simple tools available to research firms and financial professionals at www.investor.gov/CRS, which also provides educational materials about investment advisers, broker-dealers, and investing.

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We are a registered investment adviser that offers investment advisory services, including Asset Management, Wealth Advisory, Wrap Asset Management, and Family Office Services, to clients. If you open an advisory account with our firm, we'll meet with you to understand your current financial situation, existing resources, objectives, and risk tolerance. Based on what we learn, we'll recommend a portfolio of investments that is monitored at least annually, and if necessary, rebalanced to meet your changing needs and goals. We'll offer you advice on a regular basis and contact you at least annually to discuss your portfolio.

You can select in our agreement whether we are allowed to buy and sell investments in your account without asking you in advance ("discretion") or only after receiving your permission ("non-discretion"). If you select non-discretion, you make the ultimate decision regarding the purchase or sale of investments. Any limitations will be described in the signed advisory agreement. We will have discretion or non-discretion until the advisory agreement is terminated by you or our firm.

We do not restrict our advice to limited types of products or investments.

Our firm does not impose requirements for opening and maintaining accounts or otherwise engaging us.

Financial Consulting will be offered in our Asset Management, Wealth Advisory, and Wrap Asset Management services for no additional fee. Family Office services, which is offered under a separate sub-service, may include Financial Planning and Billpay & Bookkeeping services for a flat or hourly fee. We do not monitor your investments for Family Office services.

- What is your relevant experience, including your licenses, education and other qualifications? What do those qualifications mean?

What fees will I pay?

You will be charged an ongoing annual fee applied monthly based on the value of the assets in your account. Our maximum annual fee utilizing Asset Management, Wealth Advisory, and Wrap Asset Management is 2.00%. The more assets you have in your advisory account, the more you will pay us. We therefore have an incentive to increase the assets in your advisory account in order to increase our fees. Our fees vary and are negotiable. The amount you pay will depend, for example, on the services you receive and the amount of assets in your account. Our firm's fees will be automatically deducted from your advisory account, which will reduce the value of your advisory account. In rare cases, we will agree to send you invoices rather than automatically deduct our firm's fees from your advisory account.

Our maximum flat fee is \$50,000 and/or maximum hourly rate is \$500 for our Family Office services. The fee-paying arrangements will be determined on a case-by-case basis and will be detailed in the signed advisory agreement.

The custodian that holds your assets may charge you a transaction fee when we buy or sell an investment for you. The custodian's transaction fees are in addition to our firm's fees for our Asset Management services. We pay the custodian's transaction fees charged to you for our Wrap Asset Management services. The fees for wrap fee programs are therefore higher than a typical asset-based advisory fee.

You may also pay charges imposed by the custodian holding your accounts for certain investments and maintaining your account. Some investments, such as mutual funds, index funds, exchange traded funds, and

variable annuities, charge additional fees that will reduce the value of your investments over time. In addition, you may have to pay fees such as “surrender charges” to sell certain illiquid securities.

For Wrap Asset Management and Wealth Advisory clients, we select third party money managers, sub-advisers, and/or separate account managers to assist us with managing your account. If selected, they will charge you an additional fee, which will be described to you in their Form ADV and/or agreement.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

Questions to Ask Us:

- Help me understand how these fees and costs may affect my investments. If I give you \$10,000 to invest, how much will go to fees and costs and how much will be invested for me?

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means:

For our wrap services, we pay the custodian’s transaction fees charged to you. As a result, we have an incentive to recommend these asset types without transaction fees in order to reduce the amount of the custodian’s transaction fees that we will have to pay on your behalf.

How do your financial professionals make money?

Our financial professionals are compensated based on the revenue our firm earns from their advisory services or recommendations, the amount of client assets they service, and the time and complexity required to meet a client’s needs.

Our firm will receive transition assistance in the form of hard dollars.
