IAPD Information About Representatives

IAPD offers information on all current-and many former representatives. Investors are strongly encouraged to use IAPD to check the background of representatives before deciding to conduct, or continue to conduct, business with them.

What is included in a IAPD report?

IAPD reports for individual representatives include information such as employment history, professional qualifications, disciplinary actions, criminal convictions, civil judgments and arbitration awards.

It is important to note that the information contained in an IAPD report may include pending actions or allegations that may be contested, unresolved or unproven. In the end, these actions or allegations may be resolved in favor of the representative, or concluded through a negotiated settlement with no admission or finding of wrongdoing.

Where did this information come from?

The information contained in IAPD comes from the Investment Adviser Registration Depository (IARD) and FINRA's Central Registration Depository, or CRD, (see more on CRD below) and is a combination of:

- information the states require representatives and firms to submit as part of the registration and licensing process, and
- information that state regulators report regarding disciplinary actions or allegations against representatives.

How current is this information?

Generally, representatives are required to update their professional and disciplinary information in IARD within 30 days.

THE ADVISOR DENIES THE CLIENT'S ALLEGATIONS AND ASSERTS AND MAINTAINS THAT THE TRANSACTIONS FOR THE CLIENT WERE SUITABLE AND FULLY DISCLOSED. DURING THE CRASH OF 2008, THIS CUSTOMER PANICKED, AND DIRECTED THAT HIS ANNUITY BE LIQUIDATED, THUS "LOCKING IN" AN OTHERWISE AVOIDABLE LOSS; AND, FOLLOWING THE UNEXPECTED COLLAPSE OF LEHMAN BROTHERS IN THE FALL OF 2008, THE VALUE OF HIS CORPORATE BOND DECLINED, ULTIMATELY RESULTING IN A LOSS OF APPROXIMATELY 80% OF ITS VALUE. NEARLY THREE YEARS AFTER THE CRASH OF 2008, THIS CUSTOMER COMPLAINED FOR THE FIRST TIME THAT THESE TWO INVESTMENTS WERE "UNSUITABLE" FOR HIM IN 2008. ALTHOUGH THOSE ALLEGATIONS WERE FALSE, UNIONBANC ELECTED TO ENTER INTO A "COST OF DEFENSE" SETTLEMENT WITH THIS CUSTOMER, WITHOUT ADMITTING ANY LIABILITY OR RESPONSIBILITY FOR HIS LOSS. THIS REGISTRANT WAS NOT REQUIRED TO AND DID NOT PAY OR CONTRIBUTE TO ANY OF THE COST OF THAT SETTLEMENT, WHICH WAS VIEWED STRICTLY AS A BUSINESS DECISION ON THE PART OF UNIONBANC INVESTMENT SERVICES LLC.
