## IAPD Information About Representatives

IAPD offers information on all current-and many former representatives. Investors are strongly encouraged to use IAPD to check the background of representatives before deciding to conduct, or continue to conduct, business with them.

### What is included in a IAPD report?

Upon transitioning from a state-covered to a federal-covered Investment Adviser in 2006, my company did not begin making required "Notice" filings to the State. Instead, it continued making identical regulatory filings (and paying the identical filing fee) until mid-2014. However, no such filings were made from mid-2014 until mid-2019, when it realized that "Notice" filings and associated fees were required and began making them in the proper manner.

As part of the Administrative Agreement and Order resolving the issue, Altruist Financial Advisors LLC agreed to pay the \$800 in filing fees (i.e., \$200/year) that it would have paid had the four year gap of Notice filings (i.e., for 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2018) not occurred.

**Allegations:** The State cancelled my registration as an Investment Adviser Representative of a federal covered Investment Adviser because I filed a form ADV-W to withdraw my Investment Adviser company from State regulation, as directed by a State representative. Apparently, upon deleting the Investment Adviser from the State's database of State-covered Investment Advisers, the State also (accidentally and illegally) deleted all Investment Adviser Representatives associated therewith, effectively cancelling my Investment Adviser Representative registration.

**Resolution:** The State retroactively reinstated my registration as an Investment Adviser Representative effective 06/19/2014.

Other: The State retroactively restored my Investment Adviser Representative registration effective 06/19/2014 (i.e., the date it initially accidentally and illegally cancelled it).

**Broker Statement**

The State cancelled my registration as an Investment Adviser Representative (IAR) of a federal covered Investment Adviser (RIA) in 2014 because I properly filed a form ADV-W to withdraw my RIA from State regulation, as directed by a State representative. Upon deleting my RIA from their database of State-covered Investment Advisers, their computer system also deletes all IARs associated therewith -- which resulted in my IAR registration being cancelled. Apparently, in conjunction with filing the ADV-W partial withdrawal, they felt that I also should have filed a Form U-4 at the same time, but I was not notified of this requirement (nor was its necessity advertised anywhere that I am aware of).

The way the State cancelled my IAR registration was inconsistent with Sec 92 of the Michigan Administrative Procedures Act in that they gave me no notice that they were cancelling my registration, gave me no finding of fact which led to the cancellation, and gave me no opportunity to show compliance. To my knowledge, I had not violated (or been accused of violating) any of the provisions of the Michigan Uniform Securities Act (2002) sections 408 or 412 which might otherwise legitimize the cancellation of my IAR registration.

The State has retroactively reinstated my registration as an Investment Adviser Representative effective 06/19/2014.
