What is included in a IAPD report?

IAPD reports for individual representatives include information such as employment history, professional qualifications, disciplinary actions, criminal convictions, civil judgments and arbitration awards.

It is important to note that the information contained in an IAPD report may include pending actions or allegations that may be contested, unresolved or unproven. In the end, these actions or allegations may be resolved in favor of the representative, or concluded through a negotiated settlement with no admission or finding of wrongdoing.

Where did this information come from?

The information contained in IAPD comes from the Investment Adviser Registration Depository (IARD) and FINRA's Central Registration Depository, or CRD, (see more on CRD below) and is a combination of:

- information the states require representatives and firms to submit as part of the registration and licensing process, and
- information that state regulators report regarding disciplinary actions or allegations against representatives.

Employing firm when activities occurred which led to the complaint: CUNA Brokerage Services, Inc.

Allegations: Client alleges the advisor did not clearly disclose the free look options on a variable annuity contract. Client selected the return of contract value instead of return of premium. Client asserts the advisor did not discuss this with her and she did not want to invest her money until she had a return to review her contract. Advisor stated he discussed this with her and provided her with an annuity transaction summary during their meeting. Client contacted Jackson National on 10/19/18 to have the contract free looked. Jackson National sent a check on 10/23/19 for \$112,910.84. The client was not satisfied as she wanted the full return of premium payment. After further review Jackson National decided to pay the full return of premium payment despite the selection on the annuity application.

I carried out the instructions given by the client in her original paperwork. When she later decided to free look her policy, she stated she wanted a return of premium as the subaccounts had declined in value. This complaint was found with no merit during compliance review, as she signed paperwork to have her funds immediately invested, however the investment company chose to refund her the difference in premium at their discretion. This
