IAPD Information About Representatives

IAPD offers information on all current-and many former representatives. Investors are strongly encouraged to use IAPD to check the background of representatives before deciding to conduct, or continue to conduct, business with them.

What is included in a IAPD report?

IAPD reports for individual representatives include information such as employment history, professional qualifications, disciplinary actions, criminal convictions, civil judgments and arbitration awards.

It is important to note that the information contained in an IAPD report may include pending actions or allegations that may be contested, unresolved or unproven. In the end, these actions or allegations may be resolved in favor of the representative, or concluded through a negotiated settlement with no admission or finding of wrongdoing.

Where did this information come from?

The information contained in IAPD comes from the Investment Adviser Registration Depository (IARD) and FINRA's Central Registration Depository, or CRD, (see more on CRD below) and is a combination of:

- information the states require representatives and firms to submit as part of the registration and licensing process, and
- information that state regulators report regarding disciplinary actions or allegations against representatives.

How current is this information?

Generally, representatives are required to update their professional and disciplinary information in IARD within 30 days.

Sentence/Penalty:	I was given 6 months of court supervision with a start date of 05/14/2003, end date of 11/12/2003. I had to pay restitution of \$112, which was paid in full on 05/21/2003.
Broker Statement	I am embarrassed to say that this was a case of peer pressure that I fell into at 17 years old. I was not raised to steal from anyone, but I was with a friend that was so desperate to break rules and look cool, that she ended up getting me in trouble in the process. If anything, this was a learning lesson that I have carried with me



throughout life - make your own decisions, regardless of who is trying to influence you.

One of my friends/manager was a couple of years older than me and she was trying to "show off" for some older kids and allowed them to come into our place of work to steal some clothes. It just so happened to be when I was also working, so I was guilty by association. I tried to tell her it was wrong and I wanted no part in it, but unfortunately that is not how this panned out for me. She assured me no one will ever know and that she would take the blame if anything does come of it. She allowed them to take a few sweatshirts and pants because she thought it would "buy" her friendship with these older kids. She was wrong and it ended up getting us both in trouble. I was mortified when the word got out what had happened because I was not raised to be that person to do something so incredibly stupid. She did NOT take the blame, we both were charged with Retail Theft (Misdemeanor) and both had to pay restitution of the items stolen (\$112 per person). I apparently did not get the best lawyer at 17 years old either and am shocked this is still on my record, as I was only 17 years old. This was a case of wrong place, wrong time and bad influences. I ended up making a plea of guilty, as that was what my attorney said to do since I had not ever been in trouble before, I was under 18 and they offered me 6 month probation and I had to pay the \$112 restitution. I then completed the probation period, paid the court fines and restitution, which then closed the case. This experience was one I was ashamed to be a part of from the beginning, still am to this day. However, I am a believer in we all make mistakes, but I am more of a believer in DO NOT make the same mistake twice.
